- 4 Lost since medieval times (at least).

Description

Heathen, astronomer, descendant of Salomo ...

Explanation

- *Abu Jafar Muhammad ibn al-Hasan Al-Khazin* (~ 900-971) .
- Discusses Ptolemy, Egyptian mathematics.
- Known for *Zij al-Safa'ih* (Tables of the disks of the astrolabe).
- Lat. *flexus* = "arc, curve".
- *Flegetanis* = *flexatanis* = "one who draws the curves".
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- Monastery *San Juan de la Peña*.
- Close to old king's town Jaca - last stronghold before reconquista.
- Important position on the *Camino Aragones*. Tour from Troyes.
- Region known as "*Mont Salvage*" (in Occitaine).
- But: no castle, does not fit Wolfram's description.
- "Gralsburg": Loarre (Huesca).

Logical consequence

- Store holy object in monastery.
- Knights of the holy grail in relative neighborhood.

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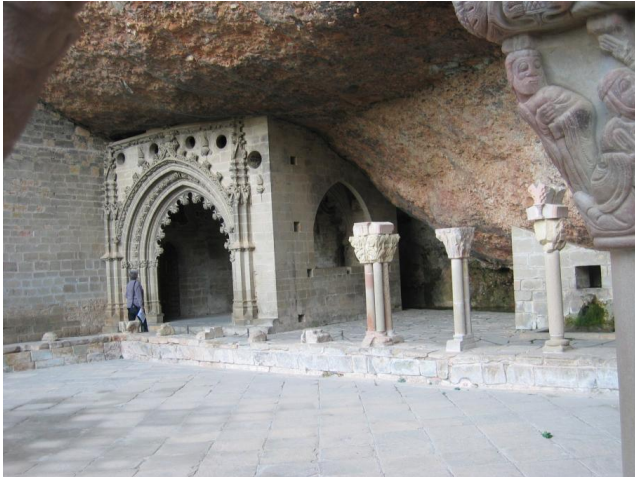

Arab conquests and reconquista

- 1 Arab conquest of Spain ~ 700 (Visigoths before).
- 2 Reconquest beginning with Galicia.
- 3 Battle of *Clavijo* (844). Victory attributed to Santiago.
- 4 Northwest relatively unimportant.
- 5 Second period: 1085-1212, Aragon became “war zone”.

Consequences

- 1 Still “first hand” experience for Chretien.
- 2 Copy in Jaca (now in Valencia).
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- 1 References: Spain? France? Germany?
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→ French revolution!
